BULLDOGS LOOK TO UPSET NO. 6 WASHBURN AT HOME ON SATURDAY AFTERNOON

THE GAME: Truman State University Bulldogs (Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association/NCAA Division II) vs. Washburn University Ichabods (Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association/NCAA Division II)
Date/Time: Feb. 14, 2004, 1:30 p.m.
Arena (Cap.): Pershing Arena (3,000)
Location: Kirksville, Mo.

BROADCAST: Bulldog basketball games are broadcast on KRES 104.7 FM in Moberly, Mo. The games can also be heard over the web at www.regionalradio.com/html/kres.html.

Sports Director Brad Boyer does play-by-play with commentary from long-time Bulldog announcer, Hank Janssen. The pregame show begins approximately 15 minutes before tip-off.

FOOD DRIVE: Truman fans will receive free admission to the Bulldogs' home games the next two Saturdays by bringing canned food goods for the Captains Roundtable food drive.

TRUMAN (6-16, 3-10 MIAA): The Bulldogs will face their second straight top-10 opponent on Saturday when they host the MIAA's top team, Washburn. The Ichabods come into the game ranked sixth in the country with a 20-1 overall record.

Only five regular season games remain and Truman is currently one-game behind Missouri-Rolla for the final spot in the Sonic/MIAA Championship. The Miners host Missouri Western this Saturday in Rolla.

Last Wednesday, Truman jumped out to an early nine-point lead over Northwest Missouri. The Bearcats' defense took over, however, in the second-half and the Bulldogs suffered their worst loss of the season by a 73-52 score.

SCOUTING WASHBURN (20-1, 12-1 MIAA): The Ichabods have dropped just one game this season, a 77-72 loss on the road at Pittsburg State. The team has won 12 MIAA games, all but three which have been close contests, decided by nine points or less.

nation with a +13.7 rebounding margin.

Seven players are averaging over seven points a game, led by Travis Robbins. Robbins has come off the bench in every game to score 13.3 points and 6.7 rebounds and he is shooting 58.8% from the field. Troy Douglas also shoots well above 50% from the field and averages 13.0 points and 5.5 rebounds. He leads the team in conference play with 13.5 points a game.

Jeremy Cunningham paces the team with 76 assists on the season and Kariton Mims has a team-high 30 three-pointers and 30 steals. Both of those players are shooting around 81% from the free throw line for the season.

Head coach of Washburn is Bob Chipman who is in his 25th season at the school. He has a career coaching record of 579-193.

SERIES RECORD: Washburn holds a 26-13 all-time advantage over Truman. The Ichabods have won nine straight in the series, the longest current losing streak for the Bulldogs against a MIAA opponent.

Truman is 10-8 all-time against Washburn in Kirksville, but the Ichabods have won in Pershing Arena in each of the last three seasons. The last Bulldog win in the series was a 78-73 victory in Kirksville during the 1999-2000 season.

**EARLIER THIS SEASON -
WASHBURN-79, TRUMAN-71
(JAN. 17, TOPEKA, KAN.)**

Washburn shot 51.9% from the field for the game, including 54.5% in the second-half, as it was able to hang on for a 79-71 victory over Truman on Saturday in Topeka.

Truman hit 18-of-19 free throws in the game. However, it shot just 37.5% from the field, including one-of-17 from its starting guards, and 27.8% from beyond the arc. The Bulldogs won the rebounding battle, 37-34, but lost the turnover numbers, 9-6.

A 17-4 run midway through the first-half gave the Ichabods a 31-19 lead and the home team went into the break with a 41-34 advantage.

Washburn regained a double-digit lead early in the second-half until Truman went on a 17-6 run, sparked by three three-pointers by Matt Brock, to get within one at 62-61 with 6:22 remaining.

The Ichabods picked up its defense at that point, holding the Bulldogs to just two field goals the rest of the way. A three-pointer by Jeremy Head with 1:09 left gave the Ichabods a six-point advantage and they hit four-of-six free throws in the final minute to seal the win.

Adam Ogle led the team with his first collegiate double-double. He had 14 points, 10 rebounds, two blocks and hit seven-of-eight shots from the field. Grant Agbo had a team-high 15 points and Brock was in double-figures, tying a career-high with 12 points.

Washburn had four players in double-figure scoring, led by Troy Douglas with 18 points. Jeremy Cunningham added 13 points, Randy Brown had 11 and Travis Robbins had 10. J.P. Meitner had a team-high eight rebounds and Jerad Head had a game-high eight assists.

**Northwest Missouri-73, Truman-52
(Feb. 11, Maryville, Mo.)**

The Bearcats dominated the final 28 minutes of play as they handed Truman its largest defeat of the season by a 73-52 score in Maryville.

Things started good for the Bulldogs and an 8-0 Truman run gave the team a nine-point lead midway through the first half. They still had a nine-point advantage at 23-14 when Northwest Missouri went on a 19-4 streak over the final 8:06 of the first period. The Bulldogs never trailed in the half until the 1:32 mark, but they went into the lockerroom down 33-27.

The Bearcats then used a dominating defense in the second-half to pull away for the easy victory. Truman scored just 15 points in the first 16 minutes of the final half and Northwest Missouri was able to build up a 24-point lead at one point.

For the game, the Bearcats shot 49.2% from the field and turned the ball over just eight times. Truman, meanwhile, shot 41.2% from the field and turned the ball over 18 times. Northwest Missouri scored 20 points off the Bulldogs' turnovers, while Truman was able to score just five off the Bearcats' miscues.

The Bulldogs had just one player in double-figures as Matt Beran scored 14. Matt Brock hit three-of-four three-pointers in the game and Chip Sodemann had a game-high six rebounds.

Five Bearcats were in double-figures, led by Byron Jackson with 12 points. He also had a team-high eight rebounds in the game. Jesse Shaw filled up the stat sheet with 11 points, six rebounds, four assists and four steals.

Truman did hold the MIAA's leading scorer, Kelvin Parker, to eight points in game. Parker hit just three-of-13 shots from the field.

**Washburn-86, Truman-67
(Feb. 11, Topeka, Kan.)**

The No. 6 Washburn Ichabods opened the second half on a 27-8 run to turn a two-point halftime lead into a 69-48 lead. Washburn cruised from there for an 86-67 win over the Bearcats.

The win marked the 21st 20-win season by Ichabod head coach Bob Chipman in his 25th year at the helm. The win was also the Ichabods' 13th straight win over the Bearcats in Topeka and the 16th straight overall in Lee Arena.

The Ichabods fell behind early by nine at 15-6, as Bearcats' David Henderson scored eight points in the first 2:18 of the game en route to 14 first-half points. The Ichabods clawed back in the game taking the lead for good on Troy Douglas' layup with 29 seconds to go in the half.

Southwest Baptist could not duplicate its hot shooting from the first half as they missed six of their first seven shots to open the second frame.

Travis Robbins led the Ichabods with 20 points on 9-of-14 shooting. He scored 12 of the Ichabods' 16 points in a 5:05 span in the first half that cut the Bearcat lead from nine to one.

Douglas scored 13 and Steve Bonner added 11.

Henderson finished with 17 for the Bearcats.

BULLDOGS IN THE MIAA: The Bulldogs are fourth in the MIAA in scoring defense, allowing just 69.3 points a game. Truman is also in the upper-half of the league statistics in field goal percentage defense (5th), rebounding margin (t-4th) and defensive rebounds (4th).

Individually, Grant Agbo is ranked seventh in field goal percentage, tenth in free throw percentage, 11th in rebounding and 13th in scoring.

Matt Beran is ranked sixth in field goal percentage, tenth in blocks and rebounding and 19th in scoring

Adam Ogle is ninth in the MIAA in blocks.

TRUMAN "D": The Bulldogs biggest improvement this season has come on the defensive end as they are allowing 69.3 points a game. If they keep that pace, it be the lowest mark since the 1998-99 season, when Truman advanced to the NCAA semifinals.

REBOUNDING MARGIN: Truman has a +2.2 rebounding margin in MIAA games and are on pace to have the best rebounding margin in conference games since the 1999-2000 season. In the 13 conference games, Truman has outrebounded its opponents in eight of them, including six out of the last eight.

Washburn leads the nation in rebounding margin with a +13.7 mark. The Ichabods have been outrebounded in just two games this season, one of those being by three boards in the first meeting with Truman.

FRESHMAN SCORING LEADER: Grant Agbo is on pace to have the fourth-highest scoring average for a Bulldog freshmen since the 1958-59 season.

Agbo currently leads the team with a 13.1 scoring average. He has scored in double-figures in 18 of the 21 games he has appeared in this season and has led or tied for the team-high in scoring in nine games.

CAREER LEADERS: Matt Beran currently has 629 career rebounds, just the 11th player in Truman history to grab over 600 boards. He needs 18 more to move into the top 10 list.

Beran has also recorded 871 points in his career, which currently ranks 28th in the Truman record books. He needs 50 more points to break into the top 20 in that list.

Only nine other Bulldogs in the history of the program have recorded over 800 points and 600 rebounds. Beran is also currently tied for fifth in career blocks with 69.

Another senior has also been climbing the career chart. Aaron Mueller has hit 103 three-pointers for his career, which ranks eighth in Bulldog history.

GETTING TO THE CHARITY STRIPE: In MIAA play, Truman has attempted more free throws than the opposition in just three games, two of those contests being Bulldog wins.

Truman is averaging 16.5 free throws a game in conference action, compared to a 23.5 average for its competition.

WINS VS. LOSSES: In Truman's six wins this season, the team is shooting 46.8% from the field and outrebounding the opposition by 6.7 boards a game. The Bulldogs are also shooting 32.6% from beyond the arc while attempting an average of just 14.3 shots from there. Defensively, they are allowing 63.5 points and team's are shooting 37.9% from the field against them.

In the Bulldogs' losses, they are shooting 39% from the field and are being outrebounded by 0.6 boards a game. The team is shooting under 30% from three-point range and attempting 17.1 shots a game from beyond the arc. Defensively, they are allowing 71.4 points a game and teams are shooting 46.2% from the field.

TRUMAN VS. NATIONALLY-RANKED TEAMS: The Bulldogs are 0-5 this season against team's that were nationally-ranked at the time of the meeting.

The last Truman win over a nationally-ranked team was a 83-71 home victory last season over Northwest Missouri, who was ranked 21st at the time.

REGIONAL RANKINGS: Through Feb. 8, four MIAA schools were ranked in the South Central region, including three in the top four spots. Washburn is first, Northwest Missouri is third, Emporia State in fourth and Pittsburg State is ninth.

MISC. NOTES: Truman has trailed at half in every game since the MIAA opener against Missouri Southern. In five out of the last seven games, the Bulldogs have outscored their opponent in the second-half ... Jack Schrader is 5-14 in his career against Washburn ... Bob Chipman is 26-9 against Truman.

1,000 WINS: The Truman men's basketball program won the 1,000th game in program history earlier this season against Harris-Stowe. This year is the 84th season of Bulldog basketball and the program has an all-time record of 1,003-893 (.529).

BULLDOG COACHING STAFF: Jack Schrader is starting his ninth season as head coach of the Truman men's basketball team. Prior to being named the head coach, he served as an assistant coach at Truman for four years under Willard Sims.

In eight years under Schrader, the Bulldogs have made five appearances in the MIAA postseason tournament. He has a 96-146 (.397) career record at Truman and, in 1998-99, led the team to one of its best seasons that concluded with an appearance in the 1998-99 NCAA championship semifinals. Truman claimed the MIAA postseason tournament championship that year

and Schrader was named the conference's co-coach of the year and the NABC regional coach of the year.

Prior to coaching the Bulldogs, Schrader coached professional and high school teams all over the world. He was a member of the Arizona State Sun Devils for three years and was drafted by the Phoenix Suns in 1975 and played professionally in Europe.

Assisting Schrader for the fourth consecutive year is Tim Deidrick. Deidrick started his coaching career under former Bulldog head coach Willard Sims in 1992 as a student and graduate assistant. He also coached at Scottsdale Community College (Ark.) and St. Louis Community College before returning to Truman in 2000.

UP NEXT: Truman travels to St. Joseph, Mo. next Wednesday for a MIAA contest against Missouri Western. The Griffons are currently 11-11 on the year and 5-8 in MIAA play.

Grand Valley State went to the free throw line 20 more times than the Bulldogs and received a big game from guard Courtney James as the Lakers defeated Truman by a 69-53 score.

James caused trouble for the Bulldogs all game long as he scored 30 points, had two rebounds, four steals and four assists. He was nine-of-13 from the field, five-of-seven from beyond the arc and hit all seven of his free throw attempts.

Southwest Baptist's Jarrett Brown stole the show in Pershing Arena as he helped his team defeat Truman by a 84-69 score.

The Bearcats won the game in the first-half as they shot 70% from the field, including six-of-nine from beyond the arc. Truman led 18-17 with 11:45 remaining, but was outscored 31-13 the rest of the period, giving Southwest Baptist a 48-31 halftime lead. The 48 points was the most Truman has allowed in the first-half this season.

The Bulldogs rallied early in the second-half, twice cutting the lead to eight. Truman couldn't contain Brown, though, as he scored 17 of his game-high 25 points in the final period, putting out every Bulldog rally and giving the Bearcats a comfortable win.

For the game, Southwest Baptist shot 58.3% from the field and hit 12-of-21 from beyond the arc. The only place the Bearcats couldn't score from was the free throw line where they were just two-of-nine. Truman won the rebounding battle 36-31, but the Bulldogs only connected on 42.2% of their shots from the field and they turned the ball over two more times.

Truman was led by Matt Beran who had a season-high 19 points and just missed a double-double with nine boards. Grant Agbo added 15 points and Chip Sodemann was in double-figures with 13. Ryan Welker came off the bench to add eight points and five rebounds.

Brown was nine-of-15 from the field and seven-of-10 from three-point range in the game. Arthur Trousdell and Cedric Ousley each scored 16 points and had a team-high six rebounds. Ousley also dished out eight assists.

TRUMAN-67, MISSOURI SOUTHERN-64

Truman shot nearly 61 percent in the second half, and Ryan Welker made four of his five three-point attempts as the Bulldogs snapped Missouri Southern's 15-game home-court winning streak, 67-64, on Saturday.

The Bulldogs also snapped a 23-game MIAA road losing streak and swept a conference opponent for the first time since the 1999-2000 season.

Welker came up with 11 second-half points and finished with 17 points for the Bulldogs. Andy Calmes also chipped in 17 for Truman, which made four of its five attempts from long range in the second half.

The Lions shot only 39.3 percent in the first half but capitalized on nine turnovers by Truman for a 33-29 lead at the break. The Bulldogs, led by 11 points from Calmes, made 48 percent of their shots in the opening half.

Missouri Southern jumped to a 38-31 lead to start the second half, but Welker's jumper 2:27 into the period sparked the Bulldogs onto a 16-4 run.

The Lions answered with eight quick points, capped by a driving layup from senior Ameer Watts, to reclaim the lead. However, back-to-back threes from Welker set up Truman for the stretch run.

Missouri Southern took a one-point lead, 62-61, after junior Hiram Ocasio converted two free throws with 1:12 left. On the next possession, Welker took a feed from senior Matt Beran and converted a layup just 14 seconds after Ocasio's score and the Lions couldn't answer.

A Watts layup pulled the Lions within three with 11 seconds to play and Beran missed two free throws with eight seconds to go that could've iced the game.

The Lions didn't get a good look at the basket on their ensuing possession and Watts' running three-point attempt caromed off the backboard just before time expired.

Watts finished with 13 points and eight assists to lead Missouri Southern, which also got 12 points and six rebounds from Ocasio. Seniors Darrell Redmond and Deon Rose added 11 and 10 points, respectively, as the Lions matched season lows with three three-pointers made and an 18.8 shooting percentage from long range.

Truman shot over 50% from the field for the second straight game and the team picked up another road victory with a 60-58 win over Southwest Baptist.

The Bulldogs led for most of the second-half, up by as many as 12-points with 11 minutes remaining. However, a 9-0 later in the half put Southwest Baptist up 55-52 and the team two ended up going into the final two minutes of the game tied.

After trading baskets, Truman's Grant Agbo put the Bulldogs up 60-58 with just over a minute remaining in the game. Southwest Baptist missed a three on the next possession, but Agbo couldn't seal the win when he missed the front end of a one-and-one with 11 seconds left. The Bearcats got off two shots in the final seconds, but both missed giving Truman a two-point win.

The Bulldogs got off to a good start in the game, using an 11-4 run midway through to take a seven-point lead. The Bearcats led just twice in the half, but both came in the final minute as a late run gave the home team a 27-26 halftime advantage.

The Mules only shot 41.2% from the field but took advantage of numerous trips to the free throw line as they defeated Truman on Saturday by a 73-56 score.

The Bulldogs made the same number of field goals as the Mules and hit three more three-pointers. Truman also won the rebounding battle by a 37-35 margin. However, the home team shot just 34.4% from the field and Central Missouri scored 20 more points than the Bulldogs at the free throw line.

Truman never led in the game but the score was still close at the break with Central Missouri leading by a 29-26 margin. The Mules never led by more than four points in the first-half.

NORTHWEST MISSOURI-73, TRUMAN-52

The Bearcats dominated the final 28 minutes of play as they handed Truman its largest defeat of the season by a 73-52 score in Maryville.

Things started good for the Bulldogs and an 8-0 Truman run gave the team a nine-point lead midway through the first half. They still had a nine-point advantage at 23-14 when Northwest Missouri went on a 19-4 streak over the final 8:06 of the first period. The Bulldogs never trailed in the half until the 1:32 mark, but they went into the lockerroom down 33-27.

The Bearcats then used a dominating defense in the second-half to pull away for the easy victory. Truman scored just 15 points in the first 16 minutes of the final half and Northwest Missouri was able to build up a 24-point lead at one point.
