TRUMAN VOLLEYBALL HEADS TO WASHBURN FOR THE NCAA SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL

Broadcast:

Truman's matches will be broadcast locally on 88.7 FM KTRM, Truman's student radio station. Bob Ell and Rebekah Wedick will call the action. The broadcast can also be heard on Teamline by calling 1-800-846-4700 and using the access code 6350. A reasonable fee will be charged for the Teamline service.

Its tournament time for NCAA Division II volleyball and the Truman State volleyball team (24-8, 13-3 MIAA) will be making its third consecutive trip to the South Central Regional tournament. The regional, being hosted in Topeka, Kan. by Washburn University, should be a wide-open affair with almost all of the teams being evenly-matched on paper.

Truman, the defending South Central Champions, earned the number two seed and receive a first-round bye. On Friday at 4 p.m., Truman takes on the winner of North Alabama and Albany State. The other side of the bracket will see Washburn face the winner of Central Missouri and Harding. The two survivors in the semifinals will meet at 2 p.m. on Saturday to decide the regional championship.

Truman has high hopes going into the regionals. The Bulldogs are playing some of their best volleyball of the year, earning three 3-0 sweeps in the last week of the regular season, including one on the road against Central Missouri. Truman is also 4-1 in the regular season against teams in the regional, splitting two games with Washburn, defeating Central Missouri twice and also knocking off North Alabama in the lone meeting between the two.

SCOUTING THE SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL TEAMS:

#21 Washburn University (29-4)

Washburn University advanced to the NCAA Tournament with an automatic bid after winning its first MIAA Championship. The Lady Blues will be the favorites, coming in as the number one seed and playing at home.

The Lady Blues won the MIAA Championship with a 14-2 conference mark, one game better than regional participants Truman and Central Missouri, after being picked seventh in preseason polls. Washburn is 12-1 at home on the year with the only setback coming against Truman back in September. The host school is 3-3 against regional teams, splitting the

season series with Truman and Central Missouri, defeating North Alabama but falling to Harding. Its only other loss during the year came against Fort Hays State.

First-year head coach Chris Herron has been the reason for the quick turnaround of the Washburn program. The MIAA coach of the year had a 75-29 mark in three years at Benedictine College prior to coming to Washburn.

#9 North Alabama (29-4)

North Alabama advanced to the NCAA South Central Regional after receiving the automatic bid for winning the Gulf South tournament last weekend. The Lions are the highest ranked team nationally out of the six regional schools and are making their seventh-straight regional appearance. North Alabama won the regional in three of those years (1998, 1999 and 2000).

Three of North Alabama's losses have come at the hands of the MIAA regional participants as the Lions have lost to Washburn, Truman and Central Missouri. North Alabama does have a win over Central Missouri on the year.

Matt Peck is in his eighth season at the school and has a mark of 278-53. He is in his 19 season as a head coach and passed 500 career wins during this past season.

#20 Central Missouri (24-8)

The Jennies will be making their Division II-record 20th appearance in the NCAA Tournament this year after receiving an at-large bid. Central Missouri finished in a tie for second in the MIAA with a 13-3 record.

The Jennies are 2-4 against the other schools in the South Central regional, splitting a pair of games against both North Alabama and Washburn and losing both meetings against Truman.

Peggy Martin is in her 27th year at the school and has a career coaching mark 890-228-8.

Harding (29-6)

Harding received the final at-large bid to the regional after having one of the best seasons in school history. Harding finished the season with a 11-1 conference mark but was knocked out in the semifinals of the Gulf South Tournament.

Harding lost to just one team all year in the South Central region, Arkansas Tech. The Lady Bisons faced only one other team in the NCAA regional, defeating Washburn by a 3-0 score.

Harding is coached by Keith Giboney who is in his third year at the school and has a record of 76-33.

AVCA COACHES POLL: The Bulldogs moved up to 17th in the latest AVCA Coaches Top 25 poll. Truman was ranked fifth in the preseason poll and moved up to fourth after the first week of the season. Following the Tampa Tournament, the Bulldogs slipped to 17th and have been between 15th and 20th since then.

Northern Alabama is ranked ninth in this week's poll, Central Missouri is 20th and Washburn is 21st. Harding and Albany State are not ranked.

A LOOK BACK AT THE 2002 SEASON: The Bulldogs entered the season with a lot of question marks after losing two all-americas and two other key players from last year's squad that went 37-2 and advanced to the Elite Eight.

The young squad received good reviews after going 4-0 at the season-opening Nebraska-Omaha Tournament including a win over then nationally-ranked Regis. The following weekend, however, playing against some of the top teams in the country at the University of Tampa Tournament, the Bulldogs dropped all four matches. All four were tightly fought however showing Truman was close to being one of the country's best.

The Bulldogs responded to the defeats by reeling off 12 straight wins. Truman once again appeared unbeatable in Pershing Arena and jumped in front of the conference race with a 7-0 record.

The winning streak would eventually be snapped at the Henderson State Tournament by the host school. That same afternoon, Truman appeared in jeopardy of losing its second straight when they fell behind North Alabama by a 2-0 score but rallied for one of its biggest wins of the year.

That match set up a rematch with second-place Washburn who was just one game behind Truman in the loss column. The Bulldogs rallied from a 2-0 deficit again but this time couldn't pull out a fifth-game win, falling for the first time in 29 matches at Pershing Arena.

Truman again rebounded with two straight home wins, including a thrilling 3-2 comeback against Columbia College, before embarking on a five-match road trip. That trip turned out not to be kind, as the Bulldogs dropped two MIAA matches to Missouri Southern and Missouri Western, and fell out of the MIAA race.

The team entered the final week of the season needing some momentum and got just that. The Bulldogs swept Central Missouri on the Jennies home court before coming home and recording two more sweeps against Northwest Missouri and Southwest Baptist.

ALL-MIAA TEAM: Three Bulldogs were named to the All-MIAA volleyball team that was released on Wednesday.

Monica Marlowe found herself in a familiar spot as she was named to the first-team for the fourth straight year. She is the first Truman player to be named first-team all-MIAA team all four years.

Joining Marlowe on the first-team was Shelby Ortwerth. The senior receives the honor for the first time after switching to outside hitter this year after being a defensive specialist as a junior.

Kelly Vogel received all-MIAA honorable mention honors. It was also the first all-MIAA award for the sophomore outside hitter.

MIAA LEADERS: Truman ended the regular season leading the MIAA conference with 17.28 kills, 15.92 assists and 20.12 digs a game. The Bulldogs were second in hitting percentage (.251) and eighth in blocks (2.17) and service aces (1.41).

Individually, Monica Marlowe was fifth in the MIAA with 11.39 assists a game. Shelby Ortwerth was fifth in kills with 3.86 and Kelly Vogel was right behind in sixth place with 3.82 a game. Jennifer Hunter moved up to eighth in hitting percentage with a .280 mark. Ortwerth was eighth in digs with 3.74 a game while Rebecca Knefelkamp was tenth in that category with 3.59 digs a game.

Redshirting 2002 season

WILSON/MIAA ATHLETES OF THE WEEK: Four different Truman players have been named Wilson/MIAA Volleyball players of the week this year. Shelby Ortwerth and Monica Marlowe have both won the award two times. Ortwerth earned the Hitter of the Week honors on Oct. 7 and this past week, Nov. 18. Marlowe earned Setter of the Week honors on Sept. 16 and Oct. 21. Jessica Sears was the Hitter of the Week back on Sept. 16 and Kelly Vogel earned Hitter of the Week honors on Oct. 28.

NATIONAL LEADERS: Through Nov. 10, Truman led the nation in kills per game and assists a game. The Bulldogs averaged 17.20 kills a game and were 0.06 kills ahead of second-place BYU-Hawaii. They were averaging 15.86 assists a game through that date, ahead of Metro State who was averaging 15.59 assists a game.

The Bulldogs were also among national leaders in digs as their 20.22 digs a game average was 19th-best in the country.

SINGLE-SEASON RECORDS: As a team, the Bulldogs will likely set school records this year in kills per game, assists per game and digs per game. They are currently averaging 17.28 kills, 15.92 assists and 20.09 digs.

Individually, Shelby Ortwerth is currently averaging the seventh-highest kill average in school history for a single season and Kelly Vogel is eighth in that category. Ortwerth is also just four kills away from breaking into the top 10 kills lists, has the tenth-highest digs per game average and is tied for third all-time with 22 double-doubles on the year (kill/dig). Monica Marlowe's 11.39 assists per game would currently place her fourth on the Bulldogs single-season list. Jessica Sears' 21 double-doubles is right behind Ortwerth in a tie for fifth-place on the single-season list.

CAREER RECORDS: Monica Marlowe has been moving up the Bulldogs career lists in many categories the entire season. She became just the second Truman player to pass 5000 assists this year and will end her career second in career assists and first in assists per game. The next assist milestone for her is the NCAA top 25 list which she is only 50 shy of breaking into. Marlowe already ranks 25th all-time in NCAA history in assists per game.

In other Truman career lists, Marlowe is tenth in service aces (117), third in digs (1424), fourth in digs per game (1.10), second in matches with 10+ digs (77), fifth in matches with 20+ digs (8), sixth in block assists (188), eighth in total blocks (207), eighth in matches played (136) and seventh in games played (460).

AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS: Truman is 4-4 this season against teams that were ranked in the AVCA Top 25 at the time they faced the Bulldogs and Truman has won the last three of these encounters.

HOW THE BULLDOGS WIN: Hitting percentage has been the key statistic for Truman this year. The Bulldogs are 24-0 when they have a higher percentage than their opponents and 0-8 when they do not.

Truman is also 24-2 when it hits above .200 for the match and 19-1 when it holds opponents under that .200 mark.

The Bulldogs also appear to like quicker matches. Truman is 12-0 in matches that are 3-0 sweeps, 9-4 in matches that go four games and 3-4 in matches that go all five games.

POSTSEASON HISTORY: Truman will be making its fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament and its third consecutive one. The Bulldogs are 4-3 all-time in NCAA postseason games.

Last season, the Bulldogs had their most successful postseason. Truman hosted the South Central Regional tournament and won its first regional title. The Bulldogs earned it with a 3-0 win over Henderson State in the regional semifinals and another 3-0 sweep in the next round against North Alabama. In the first round of the Elite Eight, Truman fell in five games to South Dakota State.

In 2000, Truman defeated two MIAA foes in the first two rounds. The Bulldogs knocked off Missouri Western 3-1 in the opener and then beat Central Missouri 3-1. In the regional finals, Truman lost a 20-18 fifth-game decision to North Alabama.

The other appearance came in 1994 and was a short one as the Bulldogs lost to Central Missouri by a 3-0 score in the opening round.

HEAD COACH QI WANG: Qi Wang is in his second season as head coach of the Bulldogs. Wang had an impressive coaching debut, leading Truman to a 37-2 overall record in 2001 and was named MIAA and South Central Region Coach of the Year.

Wang is in his sixth season at Truman after being assistant coach for four years. Since Wang has been at the school, the Bulldogs have gone 157-53 (.748), won their first outright MIAA title, shared another MIAA championship and advanced to three NCAA tournaments.

Assistant coach Becky Pike has also played a huge role in the Bulldogs' success the last six years. Pike was the head coach from 1997-2000 before accepting the assistant's role before the 2001 season. Pike was named the MIAA Coach of the Year in 2000 after Truman earned a share of the MIAA championship for the first time.
