BULLDOGS WINNING STREAK LIKELY TO BE TESTED IN A KEY WEEK OF VOLLEYBALL ACTION

The Truman State University volleyball team (18-2, 7-0 MIAA) will take an eleven-match winning streak into this week's action, which includes two contests with nationally-ranked teams.

On Tuesday night, the Bulldogs go on the road for a non-conference match at Quincy (Ill.). Friday and Saturday, Truman plays host to the Days Inn Classic. Friday, the Bulldogs have a key MIAA match against Pittsburg State, the team sitting just one game behind Truman in the conference standings. Saturday, Truman will play Christian Brothers in the afternoon and it will have a rematch with Northern Colorado at night.

Last week, Truman cruised through two MIAA contests, defeating Southwest Baptist and Missouri Southern by 3-0 scores. Last Saturday, the Bulldogs hosted nationally-ranked Rockhurst and recorded a 3-1 victory.

BULLDOGS IN THE POLL: The Bulldogs moved up one spot to No. 7 in this week's AVCA Division II coaches top 25 poll. Other MIAA schools ranked are Pittsburg State (No. 15), Central Missouri (No. 22) and Washburn (No. 23).

SCOUTING QUINCY (13-5, 5-1 GLV): The Lady Hawks are off to a great start in 2003, already matching last year's win total, and are currently tied for first in their division of the Great Lakes Valley conference. The team has won six straight heading into Tuesday's match.

Amber Heimann leads the team with 4.61 kills a game, followed by Patty Unnerstall (2.81) and Cari Masek (2.62). Meghan Pieschel has a team-high 3.80 digs a game and Heimann is right behind with 3.67 digs. Hollie Westrich is averaging 13.12 assists a game and Masek is averaging just under one block a game.

Tim Koth is in his eighth year as the head coach of the Lady Hawks and he has an all-time career mark of 101-116.

Truman has a 34-18 edge in the all-time series with Quincy, including a 3-0 win last year in Kirksville. The Bulldogs have won four straight in the series, with the Lady Hawks' last win coming in 1998.

DAYS INN CLASSIC: The Days Inn Classic promises some great action this weekend with three of the four participating teams being ranked in this week's poll. Friday's action includes a MIAA match between the top two teams, Truman and Pittsburg State, in the current conference standings. Saturday's play features a match between two of last year's Elite Eight squads as the Bulldogs and Northern Colorado hook up for the second time this year.

SCOUTING NO. 15 PITTSBURG STATE (16-1, 6-1 MIAA): The Gorillas have been one of the top stories in the MIAA this year, opening the season with a school-record 16 wins, a streak that was stopped last Friday following a 3-2 loss at Missouri Western. Pittsburg State faces Missouri Southern on Tuesday before taking on the Bulldogs.

The Gorillas have the top blocking team in the MIAA with 3.41 a game and also lead the conference with 21.08 digs a game.

The duo of Gloria Ilariogun and Dina Wathan lead the team with 3.76 and 3.60 kills a game, respectively. Ilariogun leads the conference with 1.89 blocks a game and Wathan is first in the league with 5.91 digs a game. Chrissy Elder is first in the conference with 13.11 assists a game.

Pittsburg State's turnaround has been led by head coach Ibraheem Suberu, who is in his fifth year at the school. He has a 59-88 mark at Pittsburg State and a 89-123 mark in seven years as a collegiate head coach.

Truman leads the all-time series by a 26-2 margin and has won 20 straight since the Gorillas won both matches during the 1992 campaign.

SCOUTING CHRISTIAN BROTHERS (11-10, 3-2 GSC): The Buccaneers are currently one match above .500 and have won nine out of their last 12 matches. Christian Brothers play once, on Wednesday against Central Arkansas, before the Days Inn Classic.

Before a pair of games last weekend, Nan Kimbrell was leading the team with 3.10 kills a game and Laura Washington was just below the three kills mark. Lauren Amundson leads the team with 10.63 assists and Krista Gyarmati has a team-high 3.39 digs a game. Washington and Hattie Schnacke both average over a block a game.

In-Sik Hwang is the head coach of Christian Brothers. Last year, in his first season as a head coach, he led the Buccaneers to a 12-17 record.

Truman and Christian Brothers have split a pair of matches in their series history. In 2001, the Bulldogs won by a 3-0 score, while in 1987, the Buccaneers recorded a 2-1 victory.

SCOUTING NO. 21 NORTHERN COLORADO (17-2): The Bears are 17-2 on the year and would be ranked as one of the top Division II teams in the country, except that they are beginning the transition to the Division I level this year. Both of the team's losses have come against ranked opponents in five games.

Northern Colorado is hitting nearly .300 for the season while holding teams to a .140 mark.

Three Bears are averaging over three kills a game in Terin Ledall, Amanda Wiggins and Maggie Ledall. Linnea Kiilsgaard has a team-high 13.25 assists a game, Kristi Krom is averaging 4.32 digs and Danelle Angus is recording 0.95 blocks a game.

Ron Alexander is the head coach and has a career mark of 48-5 in his second year at the school.

Truman has never beaten Northern Colorado in four previous meetings, including a 3-0 loss earlier this year.

EARLIER THIS YEAR- NORTHERN COLORADO-3, TRUMAN-0: The Bulldogs lost the third-place game of the Division II Premier Challenge to Northern Colorado by scores of 30-26, 30-19, 30-21.

Truman struggled throughout, hitting just .141, while the Bears hit .279 for the match. Jessica Sears had a team-high 14 kills and Sarah Shearman added 11. Ashley Patey had 13 digs and Rachael Shedd added 20 assists.

Game one was the best out of the three with 12 ties and several lead changes. Truman led 12-8 early but Northern Colorado scored seven straight to take the advantage. After trading the lead back and forth the score was knotted at 25, but the Bears scored five out of the next six for the win.

The second game was essentially over very quickly as the Bears scored nine straight to start the game. The Bulldogs closed the deficit to four at 14-10 but Northern Colorado went on a 11-5 run after that to put the game away.

In the final game, the Bears again jumped out early, this time at 9-3. Truman never got closer than three as Northern Colorado slowly pulled away for the win.

LAST WEEK'S ACTION:

#8 Truman-3, Southwest Baptist-0: All 19 Bulldogs saw action as the team swept the Lady Bearcats by scores of 30-18, 30-25, 30-14. Truman hit .336 for the game and held its visitors to just a .029 mark, a season-low for a Bulldog opponent.

Truman led the first game by an 11-10 score and then kept the Lady Bearcats from scoring on their next five serving rotations as the Bulldogs pulled away to a 23-15 lead that they would not relinquish.

In game two, Truman trailed 21-18 but used a 9-2 run at that point to take control of the game. Lauren Dickbernd and Micaela Walter both served during three points during that run.

Game three was all Bulldogs as they jumped out to a 20-5 lead and were never threatened after that.

Micaela Walter and Kelly Grimes both had seven kills and hit .500 or better for the match. Alex Baker had five kills in six attempts, as did Rachael Shedd who also added a team-high 24 assists. Christine Wagner had 10 assists and Ashley Patey was in double-figures with 11 digs. Julie Wohldmann had a team-high three blocks to go along with four kills and a .400 hitting percentage.

#8 Truman-3, Missouri Southern-0: A trio of hitters and strong defense helped the Bulldogs to a 30-21, 30-16, 30-24 win over Missouri Southern last night in Pershing Arena.

Missouri Southern hit just .060 on the night, compared to a .252 mark for the Bulldogs. Truman also had 24 more kills and 14 more digs than the Lions.

Sarah Shearman led the way with 19 kills, followed by Jessica Sears with 14. Tiffany Graham collected nine kills and had the best hitting percentage with a .389 mark. Rachael Shedd had 40 assists on the night. Sears led the team with 16 digs, followed by Ashley Patey with 12. Micaela Walter had a team-high five blocks.

#8 TRUMAN-3, #19 ROCKHURST-1: In front of a large Family Day crowd, the Bulldogs won a non-conference match over Rockhurst by scores of 30-23, 30-19, 27-30, 30-24.

A pair of Bulldogs had career-high performances in the win. Jessica Sears set a career-best with 28 kills in the match. She also had a .350 hitting percentage and 10 digs. Rachael Shedd set career-highs with 69 assists and 18 digs. The 69 assists is the most by a Truman player since collegiate volleyball went to rally scoring. Sarah Shearman had a double-double in the match with 19 kills and 22 digs. Annie Nickolai added nine kills and had a .444 hitting percentage. Micaela Walter led the team with five blocks.

Rockhurst was led by Jessica Shepler with 17 kills, followed by Regiane Manzato with 13 and Margot Smith with 11. Deanna Shelton had a team-high 21 assists and Shepler led the squad with 13 digs. Heidi Specht had eight blocks for the Lady Hawks, who recorded 18 blocks as a team during the match.

Game one was all Sears as she recorded nine kills and helped Truman hit .326 for the game. The score was tied at 11 when a sideout and four straight points with Walter serving help jump start a 14-6 Bulldog run that gave them the lead for good.

In the second game, Truman improved its hitting to .371 as it went up 2-0 in the match. The home team was down 6-3 early on but went on a 9-0 run, with eight of those points coming off strong serving by Shedd. The Lady Hawks got the score back within three at 18-15, but the Bulldogs quickly answered with a 5-0 run and scored 12 of the final 16 points of the game.

Rockhurst had its best hitting game in the third game, including good execution at the end of the game to force a fourth game. Truman led 26-25, but the Lady Hawks had three kills and two blocks as they finished the game off with a 5-1 run.

Game four was tight early on with 12 ties as both teams struggled scoring off their serves. The Bulldogs finally took control of the game as a 10-1 run turned a 15-14 deficit into a 24-16 lead they would not relinquish. Sears and Shearman both had seven kills for Truman in the final game.

MIAA STATISTICS: Through Oct. 6, Truman led the MIAA in assists, kills and service aces, was second in digs, third in hitting percentage and sixth in blocks.

Individually, Jessica Sears and Sarah Shearman were one-two in the MIAA in kills per game as Sears had 4.68 a game and Shearman is averaging 4.50. Sears was also fourth in hitting percentage (.324) and sixth in digs (4.36). Rachael Shedd was second in the MIAA in assists (12.67) and Micaela Walter was ninth in blocks (0.98).

NATIONAL STATISTICS: Through Sept. 28, Truman led the nation in assists (15.72), was second in kills (17.41), ninth in digs (21.15) and tied for 11th in winning percentage (.882).

Rachael Shedd moved up to 18th in assists per game with 12.55. Sarah Shearman is 30th overall and first among freshman in kills per game.

BULLDOGS APPROACHING 20 WINS: The Truman volleyball team is just two wins shy of reaching 20 victories for the 14 straight season.

SEARS MOVES INTO TOP 10 LISTS: Jessica Sears moved into Truman's career top 10 list in both kills and digs during the past week. She currently has 948 kills and 993 digs for her career. She will likely soon become just the sixth Truman player all-time to record over 1,000 kills and digs.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Earlier today, Rachael Shedd was named the Wilson/MIAA Volleyball Specialist of the Week. Last week, she averaged 13.30 assists, 2.4 digs and helped Truman hit .283 as a team. She recorded career-highs of 69 assists and 18 digs against Rockhurst and tied a career-high with five kills against Southwest Baptist.

IMPORTANT STRETCH: The Bulldogs will play an important stretch of matches the next two weeks with seven contests, four against top 25 teams. Three of the ranked teams are MIAA opponents, and all four league matches in that span are against teams near the top of the standings.

MISC. NOTES: Truman is 4-2 this year against team's ranked in the AVCA top 25 at the time of the match ... several Truman freshmen set or tied season-highs against Southwest Baptist, including Alex Baker with five kills, Kelly Grimes with seven kills and Julie Wohldmann with four kills and three blocks.

HEAD COACH QI WANG: Qi Wang, the 2002 NCAA Division II national coach of the year, is in his third season as Truman head coach and his seventh year at the school. As the head coach, he has compiled a record of 83-13 (.865), led Truman to two South Central region championships and one runner-up finish in the NCAA tournament. He was named the 2001 MIAA coach of the year and has twice been named the South Central region coach of the year.

Wang came to Truman as an assistant coach in 1997 and since that time, the program has experienced unprecedented success, with a record of 179-56 (.762).

Truman's new assistant coach this season is Carrie Lundy. Lundy had been an assistant volleyball coach at Ashland (Ohio) since 1999 and was the head women's golf coach there since 2000. She was a graduate assistant coach at Northwest Missouri from 1997-99.

UP NEXT: Truman will travel to Central Missouri on Oct. 15 before returning home for matches against Emporia State (Oct. 17) and Washburn (Oct. 18). The two home matches occur during Homecoming ceremonies at Truman.

SEASON HIGHLIGHT REEL:

◆ The Bulldogs were the preseason MIAA favorites according to the coaches' poll and were ranked fourth in the nation in the AVCA preseason poll, Truman's highest-ever preseason ranking.

◆ Truman went 4-0 at the Missouri Western Tournament and did not drop a single game. Rachael Shedd was named the tournament MVP and Sarah Shearman was also on the all-tournament team.

◆ Truman finished fourth at the Division II Premier Challenge, including a win over No. 9 West Texas A&M. Jessica Sears was named on the all-tournament team.

◆ Rachael Shedd was named the Wilson/MIAA Specialist of the Week (9/9).

◆ The Bulldogs went 3-0 at the Central Missouri Challenge, winning every game by a 3-0 margin.

◆ Tiffany Graham was named the Wilson/MIAA Hitter of the Week (9/16).

◆ The Bulldogs opened up MIAA play with a 3-0 sweep over nationally-ranked Central Missouri.

◆ Truman hit .352 in a 3-1 win over nationally-ranked Washburn, the second-highest hitting percentage in school history for a four-game match.

◆ Jessica Sears was named the Wilson/MIAA Hitter of the Week and the Sports Import/AVCA National Player of the Week (9/23). She is the third Bulldog in the program's history to receive the national honor.
