TRUMAN (10-5, 3-4 IN THE MIAA): The Bulldogs are looking to get back on the winning track as they play host to the University of Missouri-Rolla Lady Miners tomorrow. UMR has yet to win an MIAA game at 0-7 for the year, and has not registered a win since Dec. 1.

The 'Dogs need just one more conference win to match their total of last season, and they have now surpassed last year's total number of wins by one.

They have also notched double-digit wins for just the 14th time in the 30-year history of the Truman women's program.

The Truman women are 7-1 in the friendly confines of Pershing Arena this year, suffering their only loss to No. 2 Missouri Western last Wednesday.

Truman is 3-3 on the road this season, but has just one MIAA road win, that one over Northwest Missouri, 73-64 on Jan. 9.

The Truman women tied the school record for consecutive wins with their seventh in a 75-62 victory over Quincy (Ill.) to close out the non-conference slate.

The 'Dogs lead the MIAA in rebounding offense (44.4 rpg), rebounding margin (+7.9) and defensive rebounds (31.93 drpg), as well as field goal percentage defense (.343).

TRUMAN VS. PITTSBURG STATE: After three early lead changes and tied scores, the Bulldogs went on a 14-0 run at the 17-minute mark that was sparked by a layup by senior center **Jennifer Perkins (Ft. Dodge, Iowa/St. Edmond)** and continued with a three-pointer by senior guard **Wendi Sobaski**

(Packwood, Iowa/Pekin). Perkins would add three more buckets during that span, while Sobaski also struck again from long range and senior forward **Jessy Fletcher (Atlanta, Mo.)** added a pair of free throws.

The 'Dogs held onto their double-digit lead until the nine-minute mark when the Gorillas regrouped and went on a 17-2 run to take a four-point lead with 4:41 left in the first half. Truman would grab the lead two more times before intermission, but PSU out-scored the 'Dogs 7-0 in the last minute and a half to leave the scored tied at 43 at intermission.

Truman never regained the lead after the break and watched PSU open the second stanza with an 8-0 run followed by an 11-0 run that left the Bulldogs with a 17-point deficit to overcome. The 'Dogs never got the PSU lead below double-digits after that and saw the Gorillas build as much as a 19-point lead at the midway point of the second half. Truman cut the lead to 10 with nine seconds to go, but it was too little too late to keep the Bulldogs from going home with a 90-78 loss to PSU.

SOBASKI PLAYS 100TH CONSECUTIVE GAME: Wendi Sobaski will be playing in her 100th consecutive game when she takes the court against Missouri-Rolla on Wednesday. It is the third-most consecutive games played by a Bulldog and, prior to Wednesday, just 11 games off the school record of 110 set by Megan Kahn two years ago. Providing Sobaski stays healthy, she will tie that record in the season finale, and could set a new school standard for consecutive games played should the 'Dogs make postseason action. Perkins is one game behind Sobaski with 98 consecutive games played to date.

Sobaski and Perkins have not missed playing in a single game since joining the team and rank 16th and 17th, respectively, on the Truman career games played list.

ABOUT MISSOURI-ROLLA (2-13 OVERALL, 0-7 MIAA): The Lady Miners lost to Quincy 83-58 and Regis (Colo.) 76-54 to open the season and won their first game over Lincoln, 67-57.

UMR then lost to Drury 54-54 before tallying their most recent win, again over Lincoln, 73-59. Missouri-Rolla is currently on a 10-game slide, losing to Columbia College 73-69, Harding (Ark.) 67-54, SIUE 73-57, Missouri Southern 75-67, Emporia 65-41, Southwest Baptist 91-84 in overtime, Pittsburg 64-56, Washburn 66-61, Central Missouri 72-46 and Missouri Western, 73-43.

Junior center Leah Kessenich leads the MIAA in rebounding (9.0 rpg) and blocked shots (2.27 pg), and is 19th among league scoring leaders (10.5).

Sophomore guard Tiffani Rhodes leads the team in scoring (12.4 ppg) and is ranked 12th in the MIAA to start the week. She is also tied for seventh in the conference in steals (1.93 spg) and three-point field goals made (1.47 pg). Sophomore forward Rebekah Judy is fourth in conference field goal percentage (.521) and tied for 13th in rebounding (6.0 rpg).

Against Missouri Western last Saturday, Rhodes had a team high 13 points, including going 3-of-6 from three-point land, while Judy had 10 points. Freshman guard Kala Kimmel grabbed a team-high 11 boards.

IN THE LAST MEETING WITH UMR ... The Truman women snapped a five-game losing streak with a 78-66 win over Missouri-Rolla on Feb. 21, 2001, splitting with the Lady Miners for the year. Perkins scored a career-high of 35 points in the game and also set new career highs for field goals made and attempted (12-of-26) and free throws made and attempted (11-of-14).

TRUMAN VS. MISSOURI-ROLLA IN GAME ONE LAST YEAR:

Perkins struck first in the game, but UMR quickly answered to grab away the Bulldog's only lead of the game. The Lady Miners went on a 16-3 run to start the game and enjoyed their first double-digit lead by the 14-minute mark. A few minutes later, Missouri-Rolla expanded its lead to 12, but Tessa Thurman cut that to nine with a three-pointer and the 'Dogs kept the UMR

lead under 10 for the remainder of the half. Truman whittled the Lady Miner's lead down to two with 1:30 left before the break, but UMR took a 38-34 lead at intermission after hitting a jumper with seconds left.

In the second half, Missouri-Rolla out-scored the 'Dogs 19-11 through the first 10-minutes to take their largest lead of the game, 14 points. With 6:05 to go, the Bulldogs were down by 10 points and went on an 8-2 run to get their deficit down to four with about two minutes left to play. However, UMR held Truman to just one more bucket, while hitting a jumper and 4-of-4 free throws to put the final score at 73-65 in the Lady Miners favor.

SERIES RECORDS: Truman holds a 22-20 lead in the series between the two teams. Truman won the last meeting on Feb. 21, 2001 78-66, but the Lady Miners snapped an eight-game losing streak in the series with a 73-65 win in the first meeting last year on Jan. 24, 2001, in Rolla, Mo. Prior to that, the last game the Lady Miners won was on Feb. 21, 1996, when they defeated the 'Dogs 72-60 in Rolla. UMR's last win in Kirksville was that same year on Jan. 17, 75-70.

COACHES' RECORDS: Truman's John Sloop is in his second season with the Bulldogs and as a head coach. He is no stranger to Truman though, having served as the assistant coach for the men's team the previous five seasons. Last year, he guided the team to a 9-17 record and is now 19-22 (.463) for his career.

Linda Roberts is in her 12th season guiding the Lady Miners and is 120-163 (.424) during her tenure at UMR. In 24 years as a head coach, she has compiled a record of 278-289 (.490).

BULLDOGS AMONG MIAA STATISTICAL LEADERS: Perkins is second in MIAA scoring (19.3 ppg), rebounding (8.8 rpg), field goal percentage (.549) and blocked shots (1.67 bpg). She leads the MIAA in defensive rebounds (5.87 drpg) and is tied for fourth in offensive rebounds (2.93 pg) and seventh in free throw percentage (.774).

Sobaski is tied for the lead in the MIAA in three-point field goals made (2.53 pg) and is second in three-point field goal percentage (.400), while ranking 15th among conference scoring leaders (11.9 ppg).

Fisher is tied for 13th among MIAA rebounding leaders (6.0 rpg).

3-KELLI FLOYD, FR., G, (KIRKSVILLE, MO.): Floyd had a career-high seven points in back to back games vs. Central Missouri and Northwest Missouri in early January ... had four rebounds vs. Kentucky State ... made her first three-pointer vs. Greenville ... had five assists vs. Park ... had a career-high of two steals in the MIAA opener vs. SBU ... had career-highs with a 4-for-4 performance from the line in 73-64 win over Northwest Missouri on Jan. 9 ... made both shots and all three free throws vs. Central Missouri on Jan. 7.

4-KEAGAN THALIN, SO., G (GLENVIEW, ILL./GLENBROOK SOUTH): Thalín missed the first two games of the season with a broken hand ... earned her first career-start in 73-64 win over Northwest Missouri and has started the last four games ... had five rebounds vs. Greenville and Pittsburg on Jan. 19 ... had a new career-high with two three-pointers and tied her career-high with four made field goals in the league opener vs. SBU ... also made two threes in first PSU encounter, along with a tying her career-high with five assists in that game ... had her first double-figure outing of the year in first SBU game with 11 points.

10-JESSY FLETCHER, SR., F (ATLANTA, MO.): The only player to start every game last year, Fletcher started this year's season-opener, as well as three of the last four games, and has been a valuable contributor off the bench in between ... had season-highs with 14 points vs. Kentucky State and 11 rebounds vs. Lincoln ... had career-highs with 8-of-10 free throws vs. Metropolitan State and Kentucky State ... had two blocks vs. Graceland ... had three thefts vs. No. 2 MWSC.

13-ROBYN GERBER, SR., G (AFFTON, MO./LUTHERAN SOUTH): Started all 11 games she has played in, but missed two games with a back problem ... had a personal season-high of seven points vs. Quincy ... had a team season-high with six assists in Washburn win ... also made the game-winning shot at the buzzer in 55-53 win over WU ... made 3-of-6 free throws vs. Metro State.

22-WENDI SOBASKI, SR., G (PACKWOOD, IOWA/PEKIN): Has started every game after missing last season while recovering from knee surgery ... leads the team with 38 three-pointers ... became school career record-holder for three-pointers (now with 235) during her junior season ... has scored in double figures in 11 games and led the team with 19 points vs. Kentucky Wesleyan ... was 5-of-9 from long range vs. Greenville ... made at least two treys in 12 games this year ... made all six technical free throws vs. Kentucky State ... ranks sixth among Truman career scoring leaders with 1,229 points ... is third in consecutive games played at Truman with 99.

23-EMILY TURNBULL, SO., G (TOULON, ILL./STARK COUNTY): Started at point guard in two games ... made a career-high 2-of-2 three-pointers vs. Graceland ... is second on the team with 32 assists ... had five rebounds vs. Lincoln ... was 4-of-4 from the line against Quincy.

with 4-of-6 free throws vs. Kentucky State ... had her first block vs. Graceland ... tore her ACL in Missouri Western game and is out for the season.

35-JENNIFER PERKINS, SR., C (FT. DODGE, IOWA/ST. EDMOND): Perkins was named the MIAA's fourth woman athlete of the week after averaging 19.0 points and 4.0 rebounds and assists in victories over Lincoln and Park ... also named MIAA player of the week after averaging 23.7 points over a three-game span that included 27- and 25-point efforts in wins over Northwest Missouri and Emporia, respectively ... scored 34 points vs. Metropolitan State, one off of her career high, and had 30 points vs. Park ... has scored in double figures in 14 of 15 games this year ... has eight double-doubles for the season, most recently with 16 points and 10 rebounds vs. Missouri Western on Jan. 16 ... tied for the team-lead with 33 assists and added a career-high five assists vs. Park ... led the team in scoring in 11 games and has led or tied for the lead in rebounding 12 times this year ... is now fifth among Truman career points leaders with 1,280 ... fifth all-time in rebounding at Truman with 669 ... fourth in career field goals made (537) and consecutive games played (98) ... continues to add to her school record 91 career blocked shots ... has 67 double-figure scoring efforts for her career, along with 22 double-doubles, 17 games with more than 20 points and three games with more than 30 points.

40-JENNIFER FISHER, JR., F (FORDLAND, MO./MARSHFIELD): Started 11 consecutive games to start the season and a total of 12 for the year ... had her best game of the year with 15 points in the season-opener loss to No. 15 Northern Michigan ... had double-doubles vs. Metropolitan State (Colo.) (10 pts., 12 rebs.); Kentucky State (12 pts., 10 rebs.) and in the MIAA opener vs. SBU (14 pts., 10 rebs.) ... was 4-of-6 from long range vs. Pittsburg State and had five assists ... had two blocks and 12 defensive rebounds vs. Metro State ... tied for third all-time at Truman with 54 blocked shots ... moved into the eighth spot among Bulldog career three-point leaders with 60.
